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PORTO

We arrive in Porto this morning, passing under the city's spectacular bridges. Strategically sited overlooking the Douro as it empties into the Atlantic, Portugal's second largest city was originally a Roman town, but its wealth is derived from its knowledge of the sea routes to India, with fortunes made from trading spices, silks and other fine goods. Porto is synonymous with wonderful port wine and all the famous port producers are here, such as Calem, Sandeman and Ferreira, so a visit here would not be complete without a tour of one of them. You'll learn about this fortified wine's fascinating history and its close British connections. Port is made from grapes still pressed in the traditional way – by feet – then lovingly matured, sometimes for decades, before you can enjoy its subtle flavours. Of course, you'll get the chance
