BIGGIN HILL MEMORIAL MUSEUM AND DOWN HOUSE

Tuesday 9th April 2019

We leave Hartley by 08.30 and travel by coach to Biggin Hill in the morning and Down House (Home of Charles Darwin) in the afternoon

We hear the story of Britain's most famous fighter station through the personal experiences of those who served there, and the community that supported them.

The museum is situated on the same site as St George's RAF Chapel of Remembrance, built in 1951 to preserve the legacy of those who served and died at Biggin Hill during the Second World War



Down House belonged to the great scientist Charles Darwin, who lived here for 40 years until his death in 1882. After moving to the house in 1842, Darwin and his wife, Emma, remodelled the house and its extensive gardens, which Darwin used as an open-air laboratory. It was here that Darwin developed his theory of evolution by natural selection and wrote his groundbreaking work *On the Origin of Species by Means of Natural Selection* (1859).

The cost of £45 is inclusive of the coach, one course lunch at the George and Dragon, Downe, and entry to both Biggin Hill (with guide) and Down House (Audio Guide)
