Introduction

This policy explains Hadara's intentions and methods to safeguard the Health and Safety of our membership. Hadara do not have any employees or own any premises so we are not covered by the 1974 Health and Safety at Work etc Act. Our decisions and actions are guided by the policy below.

Policy Statement

Every member of Hadara is responsible for their own Health and Safety and the Health and Safety of those around them. Hadara committee members have a responsibility to consider the Health and Safety aspects of all plans and decisions.

Practical Implementation

The committee are responsible for ensuring that premises used by the club are suitably managed by the owners/hirers. For example, fire precautions, equipment and electrical safety, certifications, cleanliness, etc. The committee will advise the hirers of any problems discovered during use, e.g. damaged cables.

The committee will ensure that only reputable companies are hired for transport, accommodation, food, trips, tours, holidays etc. These providers will be informed of any problems discovered.

Advice to members

Before monthly meetings begin, the members will be reminded of the location of the fire exits and assembly area and the need to advise the membership secretary if they need to leave the meeting early. Details of any new permanent or temporary hazards will be included in this introduction.
